

## **2018 AGM Regulation Report**

**Date May 2018**

### **Committee Composition and Mandate**

1. FACT Manitoba is comprised of eight associations: Manitoba Chapter of the Canadian Counselling and Psychotherapy Association (CCPA), the Manitoba Chapter of the Canadian Association for Spiritual Care (CASC), the Manitoba Branch of the Professional Association of Christian Counsellors and Psychotherapists (CACCP), the Music Therapy Association of Manitoba (MTM), the members of the Canadian Art Therapy Association (CATA) based in the Province of Manitoba, the members of the North American Drama Therapy Association (NADTA) based in Manitoba, the members of the Canadian Professional Counselling Association (CPCA) based in Manitoba, and the Manitoba Association of Marriage and Family Therapy (MAMFT).
2. FACT-MB Executive will be comprised of no more than one voting officer representing an association, and that the executive may appoint non-voting ex-officio members for specified responsibilities.
3. FACT MB currently has executive officers are as Chair, Vice Chair, Secretary, Treasurer, and Communication Officer. All of the Associations have Representatives at the committee meetings and may have Alternate Representatives in attendance as well.

### **Activities**

4. FACT-MB holds monthly meetings.
5. FACT-MB has appreciated the support of Barbara McCallum from CCPA, who has helped with the application itself, with the website construction, and has been available for ongoing consultation.
6. FACT MB has established a membership fee structure and calculation based on number of Manitoba members per association.
7. CCPA's nationally validated Scope of Practice (2011) has been tentatively adopted by FACT MB, although CAMT, PACCP, and MAMFT are still in process of clarifying their own association's Scope of Practice.

### **Current Priorities**

8. The Regulated Health Professions Act Application has 10 Criterion, which focus on 10 broad areas of concern to Manitoba Health. Groups have been formed to work through those sections of the application, and general progress is being made. Criterion 2, Sufficiency of Supervision has already been presented to our Board and has been adopted. The Committee has determined a need to begin consultation with a lawyer on the legal matters
9. FACT MB has invited Indigenous voices to consult with, including Bill Thomas (CCPA), Grand Chief Arlen Dumas (Assembly of Manitoba Chiefs), Grand Chief Jerry Daniels (Southern Chiefs Organization), Jennifer Wood (Manitoba Keewatinawi Okimakanok), Keewatin Tribal Council, and Manitoba Metis Federation to honour and implement the recommendations of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission.
